Thanks to a mammoth effort from our staff and volunteers, this year's Royal Cornwall Show has been a huge success for our charity. Our now much larger stand (introduced 2 years ago) and shop raised a massive £17,200!

117,000 plus people visited the annual show at Wadebridge and many were looking for a bargain. Our stand was busy from 8am in the morning until after 6pm in the evening, as Frazer Hopkins, our Income Generation Director, explains; "The minute we opened our marquee on the Thursday morning people were buying and there was a steady stream of folk throughout the three days. What really stood out for me was the collaboration between departments.

Staff and volunteers worked together and the end result was the

financial success and the conversations and contacts that were made as a result of being at Cornwall's premiere event. Thank you everyone for your support.

We're already talking about how we can learn and improve for the 2025 show!



This year the show was held in Volunteers Week, which for its 40th anniversary ran from the 3rd to the 9th of June. Did you know we now have 1,150 volunteers? Each one is vital, saving us money and supporting our work in every department. The valuable gift of time helped us in many ways in the last financial year (2023/24).





We cared for 351 inpatients at our hospices, our bereavement counsellors at each hospice gave support to grieving families and friends at 1,810 appointments and our Lymphoedema specialists oversaw 1,727 appointments.

Our Community Services teams reached many more bereaved people, providing 563 Listening Ear appointments, welcoming 197 to our Walk Talk Kernow activities and 91 to our Bereavement Help Points.

Working together will be at the heart of our next big external adventure, our Sustainable September Fashion Show at Truro Cathedral. Watch out for more news about this in the coming weeks and months."
